

Ismail Fajrie Alatas is an Assistant Professor of Middle Eastern and Islamic Studies at New York University. He holds a Ph.D. in Anthropology and History from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. His research explores the intersections of religious authority, social formation, mobility, semiotics and communicative practice with a focus on Islamic Law, Sufism, and the Ḥaḍramī diaspora in Indonesia (that is, those who trace their origins to the Ḥaḍramawt valley of Southern Yemen). He has published articles in *Comparative Studies in Society and History*, *Journal of the Royal Anthropological Institute*, *Indonesia and the Malay World*, *Journal of Islamic Studies*, *Die Welt des Islams*, and *Studia Islamika*. He is currently preparing his monograph, entitled *What is religious authority?: Cultivating Islamic community in Indonesia*, for publication.
