

Nabil Echchaibi is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Media Studies and Associate Director of the Center for Media, Religion and Culture at the University of Colorado Boulder. His research focuses on religion and the role of media in shaping and reflecting modern religious identities among Muslims in the Middle East and in Western societies. His work on Muslim media cultures, Islamic modernity, and decoloniality has appeared in various journals and in many book publications. He is the author of *Voicing Diasporas: Ethnic Radio in Paris and Berlin Between Culture and Renewal* and the co-editor of *International Blogging: Identity, Politics and Networked Publics*. He's currently working on two books: *Unmosquing Islam: the Myth of the Muslim Subject* and *The Transparent Muslim: Muslims between the Blackmail of Transparency and the Right of Opacity*. Dr. Echchaibi has also written opinion columns in the popular press, including the *Guardian*, *Forbes Magazine*, *Salon*, *Al Jazeera*, the *Huffington Post*, *Religion Dispatches*, *Open Democracy*, and *Latino Rebels*.
